The 211 service is provided by more than 200 local organizations that are committed to serving their communities. Many different kinds of organizations operate the 211 service, including United Ways, Goodwill, Community Action Partnerships, and local crisis centers." (211.org)

Dialing 211 is going to be your first step in locating resources in your area to address your needs. By connecting with a 211 operator, you'll be able to present your needs and have a real person assist you in finding options in your area.
